

the first five years, or 2,000 days, of life. Studies have shown that a child's experiences during those early years literally build the architecture of their brain. Richer early childhood experiences, science has discovered, lead to even more neural connections, which help set children up for lifelong success.



The Austin/Travis County Success By 6 Coalition creates opportunities for infants, toddlers, and young children impacted by poverty, especially those who identify as BIPOC, to receive high-quality education before they enter Kindergarten, while also fostering a community of parents, caregivers, and teachers ready to provide high-quality care. Our alliance creates a future in which all children enter Kindergarten healthy, happy, and ready to succeed in school and life.

THE TRUTH IS:



Children from families with low income who attend pre-K are more than twice as likely to be school-ready, but only 16% of eligible 3-year-olds are served by pre-K3. (E3 Alliance)



1 in 3 children live in a very low or low opportunity neighborhood.

Low opportunity neighborhoods are based on economic and demographic factors such as income level, educational opportunities, health environment, concentrated inequity, and more. (United Way for Greater Austin and Diversity Data Kids)
